NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 2, 2020 - For the week ending November 1, 2020, there were 4.7 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 24% very short, 40% short, 34% adequate, and 2% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 23% very short, 37% short, 37% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 1% very poor, 8% poor, 49% fair, 39% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 94%, ahead of 85% last year and 89% for the five-year average.

Corn harvested was 84%, well ahead of 9% last year and 48% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 69%, well ahead of 21% last year, and ahead of 54% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 16% very poor, 29% poor, 39% fair, 16% good, and 0% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 12% very short, 34% short, 54% adequate, and 0% surplus.
