NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 16, 2020 - For the week ending November 15, 2020, there were 5.4 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 24% very short, 41% short, 33% adequate, and 2% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 25% very short, 39% short, 34% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 6% poor, 47% fair, 42% good, and 2% excellent.

Corn harvested was 97%, well ahead of 21% last year and 70% for the five-year average.

Sunflowers harvested was 93%, well ahead of 33% last year and 73% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 16% very poor, 32% poor, 39% fair, 12% good, and 1% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 15% very short, 33% short, 52% adequate, and 0% surplus.
