NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 8, 2021 - For the week ending November 7, 2021, there were 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 16% very short, 32% short, 49% adequate, and 3% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 31% very short, 33% short, 34% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 8% very poor, 23% poor, 45% fair, 22% good, and 2% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 96%, near 97% last year and 93% for the five-year average.

Corn harvested was 82%, behind 92% last year, but well ahead of 59% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 67%, behind 83% last year, but near 65% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 47% very poor, 27% poor, 19% fair, 7% good, and 0% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 31% very short, 41% short, 28% adequate, and 0% surplus.
