NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 22, 2021 - For the week ending November 21, 2021, there were 4.7 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 16% very short, 28% short, 53% adequate, and 3% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 30% very short, 33% short, 35% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 25% poor, 41% fair, 24% good, and 6% excellent.

Corn harvested was 95%, near 99% last year, but ahead of 76% for the five-year average.

Sunflowers harvested was 90%, behind 95% last year, but ahead of 78% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 47% very poor, 27% poor, 18% fair, 8% good, and 0% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 30% very short, 40% short, 30% adequate, and 0% surplus.
