NORTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

FARGO, N.D. November 13, 2023 - For the week ending November 12, 2023, there were 4.5 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 3% very short, 14% short, 77% adequate, and 6% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 5% very short, 26% short, 67% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 31% fair, 53% good, and 11% excellent.

Corn harvested was 76%, behind 95% last year, but near 72% for the five-year average.

Sunflowers harvested was 59%, well behind 90% last year, and behind 72% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 2% very poor, 13% poor, 35% fair, 47% good, and 3% excellent.

Stock water supplies rated 3% very short, 11% short, 84% adequate, and 2% surplus.
