Excellent Week for Field Work: Pennsylvania had an average of 6.5 days suitable for field work last week. Yet another dry week allowed for abundant hay making allowing some to fill stocks completely. Those who hadn't already started harvesting corn for silage began this week. Corn and soybeans continue maturing well in these dry conditions with soybean harvests beginning in some counties. Aside from some possible showers on Tuesday it looks like we're in for another partly cloudy, cool and dry week. Expected field activities include spreading manure and fertilizer, silo filing and haymaking.

ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County had a nice week of early fall weather. Started off 48 degrees on Monday with daytime temperatures in the mid 70's. Tuesday was 53 sunny and blue skies with a few clouds. Wednesday morning was 48 degrees and into the mid 70's with sunny/blue skies, Thursday started off cloudy mid 50's but by lunchtime sunshine and mid 70's. Today started off 48 degrees with sunny, blue skies and suppose to get into the 70's. Weekend is to be nice but cooler. Corn and soybeans continue to mature. Corn silage is being harvested and other early corn starting to dry down but moisture still pretty high. Most corn looks pretty good except in areas that didn't get some rains this summer. Soybeans are looking pretty good. Early soybeans leaves are starting to color and some dropping off. Fall seedings of hay, barley, wheat and other forage crops are occurring in the county. More wheat will be seeded once corn and soybeans are harvested. Hay continues to be made this week. Peach harvest is completed. Most producers had a nice crop this year and prices were decent as Western PA and other states didn't have too many peaches available. Apples continue to be harvested with more varieties ready to harvest. Packing houses for Fresh apples and Processors for apples to be processed into various ways of enjoying an apple are busy receiving apples. Upper Adams Jaycees are preparing for the 50th National Apple Harvest Festival which will be held October 4-5 and 11-12 near Arendtsville, PA. Vegetables are still being harvested around the county also with cooler temperatures coming the fresh vegetables will soon be completed. Pumpkins have been picked and sold so all can enjoy this fall. Nice yields for pumpkins are being reported in the county. Overall the producers are still busy planting for next year, harvesting for this years crops and readying equipment for use on their farms. Daylight time to work is getting shorter due to Fall arriving soon.

ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr

Dry weather has helped with apple harvest. Looks like a normal season at this time. Corn harvest is well under way and most of the silage crop has been harvested. Some areas were a little light but most of the area was above normal. Looks like an exceptional bean crop coming on.

ADAMS County, Lee Showalter

Gala harvest has been completed. Quality was excellent. Honeycrisp harvest will be complete early this week. Quality has been excellent. Golden Delicious harvest for the fresh market will commence this coming week. Quality is very good with some variability in size.

ALLEGHENY/BEAVER/BUTLER/ County, Luke Fritz

Hay and corn silage being harvested.

CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker

Great weather for outdoor tasks. 3/8 inch of rainfall for the week.

JUNIATA/SNYDER County, William C. Sheaffer

The dry soil conditions is causing the corn to ripen at a fast pace. Some of the best quality dry hay was made this week. Fall seeded crops; especially Alfalfa is suffering. Main activities for the week were silo filling, haymaking and preparations for fall harvest.

LANCASTER County, Jeff Graybill

Significant acreage of soybean harvested end of last week. Yields very good if not quite what they were last year. Many growers will start high moisture and some dry shelled corn this week. Tobacco harvest is winding down-looking like an excellent crop. Small grain and cover crop plantings are going out this week.

MERCER County, Jim Rust

Many acres of hay was baled last week and most baled in good condition. Weather outlook for this week is excellent for drying hay. Local Amish are cutting and hauling corn silage. Area produce auctions and farmers markets are selling excellent produce.

WESTMORELAND County, Thomas Sierzega

Dry week. Corn and soybeans progressing. Could use some rain. Very dry conditions developing.

YORK County, John Rowehl

Continues to be dry.
