<u>Good Week for Field Work:</u> Pennsylvania had an average of 4.5 days suitable for field work last week.

Warmer, drier weather this week allowed for continued field activity. Many harvests are nearing completion. Corn moisture is still high enough to cause some to delay grain harvests while silage harvests have nearly all finished. Unseasonably warm weather is expected this Tuesday with temperatures spiking in the mid 70s and quickly dropping after. Cool but dry weather in the low 50s is forecast for the remainder of the week. Expected field activities include harvesting and planting.

#### ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County started the week off around 36 degrees on Monday with daytime temperature getting to 60. Last evening rain started. Tuesday 38 degrees and rained early morning then sun burned through by around 8 am then cloudier as the day went on and got to 56 around noon and rained early evening with York Springs receiving around ¼ inch of rain. Wednesday morning started around 53 degrees and rained early morning and off and on during day and evening was in the 60's and windy. Thursday was also 53 and cloudy and windy till lunchtime then some sunshine. Friday stated 57 and daytime temperature rose to high 60's and was nice day. Windy Friday through Sunday but Sat/Sun temperatures were pretty nice in the higher 60's. Corn and soybeans continue to mature in some cases where crops planted later. Corn and soybeans continue to be harvested also but some moisture is still pretty high in corn and also field conditions have to improve a little from rains. Decent yields are being reported for what is being harvested. Some hay was made but about finished due to the short days. Wheat and barley continue to emerge that was planted earlier and with the rains last week didn't get much seeded this week. Some producers hoping to still plant wheat after they get their corn and soybeans harvested. Apples continue to be harvested and producers are seeing pretty decent yields this year. Prices are pretty good also for the apple crop. Vegetables are winding down in the county and with frost a few days is also ending the vegetable season. Overall the producers are happy to be harvesting pretty good crops overall and also being able to get some small grains planted for next year's harvest. Producers are reminded that FSA offices need to see them to report their hay, forage crops and any small grains that they seeded this fall before the November 15th deadline.

#### ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr

Corn harvested for grain is still testing above 15% and producers are holding off in harvesting for a few more days. Pastures are slowing up due to cool nights. Apple harvest is in final stages with mostly processing apples being harvested.

#### ALLEGHENY/BUTLER/BEAVER, Luke Fritz

Fall harvest resumes as dry weather returns.

#### **CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker**

Good week for field work. Soybean harvest well under way. 1/8" rainfall. Some corn moisture down to 17%.

#### CLARION/FOREST/VENANGO County, Tom Tanner

Most producers done harvesting corn silage. Some soybean harvesting. Fall planted crops and cover crops have greened up.

#### JUNIATA/SNYDER County, William C. Sheaffer

Fall harvest is in full swing with yields ranging from below to above average. Good weather has allowed the harvesting of late hay. Main activities for the week were harvesting and planting.

#### POTTER County, Nicole L. Santangelo

Dry weather allowed for some field work earlier this week, locally heavy rains depending on geography. Grain crops are nearing maturity.
