**Good Week for Field Work:** Pennsylvania had an average of 4.5 days suitable for field work last week. Progress with soybean and corn grain harvests is moving steadily, both crops having dried well due to last week's favorable weather. Apple and grape harvests as well as alfalfa cuttings have neared completion and have all reported favorable crop conditions in spite of a late finish. This week's forecast predicts a daytime high in the mid 60s on Tuesday but steadily dropping as low as 29 degrees by Saturday night. A mix of rain and snow may hit us by next Monday. Expected field activities include harvesting, applying lime and spreading manure.

### November 9, 2014 Pennsylvania Weekly Weather Summary

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney**

Adams County started the week Monday with 48 degrees and daytime 57 and nice for this time of year. Tuesday was 45 degrees and daytime ended up at 66 degrees with some sun and some clouds. Wednesday was 58 morning temperature and cloudy and warmed to 62 degrees during day. Thursday 1/2 inch of rain and 50 degrees morning and rainy most of day. Friday was windy and high 40's daytime and sun and clouds. Heavy frost on Saturday and Sunday was high 40's. Over all for this time of year still pretty decent weather and temperatures. Corn and soybeans continue to be harvested in the county and still a good amount yet to be harvested. Some stalks were affected from high winds a few days last week. Corn is finally drying down some with the help of the wind. Small grains and forage crops seeded earlier this fall are looking nice and some producers are still seeding some wheat after their corn/soybeans are harvested. Hay making is about complete for the year but a few acres may be made yet. Apple harvest is winding down with majority of producers finishing up. A good crop is being reported for the majority of the county. Vegetables are about done being harvested unless in a high tunnel with some temperature protection. Overall the producers are taking advantage to harvesting their crops when the conditions permit. Producers are reminded to report their small grains planted this fall and any hay they will harvest in 2015 crop year to the Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices before the November 17, 2014 deadline to avoid any late-file fees.

#### **ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr**

Freeze this week has finished the growing season. Most of the apples are now finished, with a good year for quality and price. Corn and soybean harvest is progressing since they have dried sufficiently in the field to reduce drying cost. We had a rash of barn fires in the western part of Franklin county with three large barns in 48 hours with 20+ animals, considerable hay and equipment being lost.

#### **ALLEGHENY/BEAVER/BUTLER County, Luke Fritz**

Soybeans and corn are being harvested. Some producers applying lime and manure.

#### **CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker**

Corn Harvest continues. Some light showers and the first snow flurries.

#### CLARION/FOREST/VENANGO County, Tom Tanner

Harvesting soybeans, corn silage and shelled corn. Some fall spraying and liming of fields.

#### JUNIATA/SNYDER County, William C. Sheaffer

Heavy frost on Saturday ending the growing season. Main activities for the week were harvesting corn, chopping corn stalks, and machinery maintenance.

#### LANCASTER County, Jeff Graybill

A fair amount of corn and soybean are still standing in the fields. Winter grains and cover crops developing nicely. Most areas of the county have not had a killing frost yet.

#### **LEBANON County, Charlene Ziegler**

The early planted corn and soybeans harvest is just about finished. Double cropped soybeans and corn are close to being ready to harvest. Manure pits are still being emptied for the winter. Cover crops continue to be planted. Some rain showers came through the county but did not delay the work.

#### **MERCER** County, Jim Rust

Excellent week for field corn harvesting. Amish are finishing up with hand picking of field corn. Soybean harvesting will return as excellent weather is forecasted for first few days of this week. Fall farm chores are being completed before the jet stream changes the weather later this week.

#### **PERRY County, David . Swartz**

Along with shelled corn and soybean harvests, farmers harvested a 6th cutting of alfalfa during the past week. The dry conditions of the early part of the week allowed for corn stover to be harvested, usually in round bales

#### POTTER County, Nicole L. Santangelo

Cool weather, slowing grain dry-down.

### UNION County, James C. Brubaker

This has been the best yield of both corn and beans that we have ever had. It has been a very nice harvest season.
