Good Week for Field Work: Pennsylvania had an average of 5.0 days suitable for field work last week. Corn and soybean harvests continue unimpeded in most districts while some are still holding off over concerns with moisture. Some rains today and more expected this time next week, but in between expect cool and sunny weather ranging from the low 30s to the upper 40s. Expected field activities for the week planting cover crops, baling corn fodder, hauling manure, mowing orchards and continued harvesting of corn and soybeans.

November 16, 2014 Pennsylvania Weekly Weather Summary

ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County started the week Monday with 48 degrees and daytime 57 and nice for this time of year. Tuesday was 45 degrees and daytime ended up at 66 degrees with some sun and some clouds. Wednesday was 58 morning temperature and cloudy and warmed to 62 degrees during day. Thursday 1/2 inch of rain and 50 degrees morning and rainy most of day. Friday was windy and high 40's daytime and sun and clouds. Heavy frost on Saturday and Sunday was high 40's. Over all for this time of year still pretty decent weather and temperatures. Corn and soybeans continue to be harvested in the county and still a good amount yet to be harvested. Some stalks were affected from high winds a few days last week. Corn is finally drying down some with the help of the wind. Small grains and forage crops seeded earlier this fall are looking nice and some producers are still seeding some wheat after their corn/soybeans are harvested. Hay making is about complete for the year but a few acres may be made yet. Apple harvest is winding down with majority of producers finishing up. A good crop is being reported for the majority of the county. Vegetables are about done being harvested unless in a high tunnel with some temperature protection. Overall the producers are taking advantage to harvesting their crops when the conditions permit. Producers are reminded to report their small grains planted this fall and any hay they will harvest in 2015 crop year to the Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices before the November 17, 2014 deadline to avoid any late file fees.

ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr

Cold weather has arrived, but dry weather has allowed the completion of soybean harvest. Corn for grain harvesting is finishing up. Activities included planting cover crop, baling corn fodder, hauling manure, mowing orchards, and preparing for winter.

BUCKS/MONTGOMERY Counties, Dr. Steve De Broux

The growers are making unusually slow progress in the harvest of corn and beans. Are they opting for field-drying to save fuel costs?

CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker

Good week for field work.

CLARION/FOREST/VENANGO County, Tom Tanner Harvesting soybeans and shelled corn.

JUNIATA/SNYDER County, William C. Sheaffer

Harvesting of corn and soybeans continues, while a few made some late hay. Harvesting was the main field activity for the week.

MERCER County, Jim Rust

Area field corn growers are reporting far too many low test weights along with lower yields this year. Many corn fields still standing while the wait for moisture to drop. Changes in the jet stream and weather has ground soybean harvesting to a halt.

MONTGOMERY County, Andrew Frankenfield

Excellent weather early in the week to finish up harvesting most of the remaining soybeans in the field. First snow of the season came Thursday evening with around an inch of accumulation. Still some corn needs to be harvested. Some rye was planted as a cover crop then it turned cold, we'll see if it ever emerges before winter. Yields have been running around average for both corn and soybeans.

WESTMORELAND County, Thomas Sierzega

Winter has set in with first dusting of snow and temperatures in the 20's. Corn and soybean harvest in full swing. Dry conditions still persist.
