Good Week for Field Work: Pennsylvania had an average of 5.0 days suitable for field work last week. Reported temperatures for Pennsylvania include an average state average of 66(°F), a high of 96(°F) and a low of 41(°F). The week started with particularly warm weather but rains finally appeared last Thursday and intermittently throughout the weekend. Field crops perked up a bit as a result, but those long suffering from heat stress need even more. Cooling temperatures should mitigate additional heat stress and have already have complimented the coloring of red apple varieties nicely. The majority of field activities involved the harvesting of apples potatoes and pumpkins with corn silage nearing completion.

## **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **ADAMS County, Judy Behney**

Adams County had a pretty hot week of weather starting morning temperatures low 70's and into high 80's. Thursday received various amounts of rainfall across county. Most of county got some ranging from 0.7" other parts of Adams County but some areas Northern Adams County around York Springs got 4.75 inches and in York Springs6 inches. Cooler temperatures after the rain came in the 60's. Today is cooler 60's and sunny. Corn silage continues to be harvested and some dry corn starting to be harvested. Soybeans losing their leaves and soon to be harvested. Double cropped soybeans still maturing. Hay continues to be baled. Small grains as barley and wheat being seeded. Apple harvest continues with more varieties being harvested. Good crop being reported with nice size. Vegetables continue to be harvested around the county. Overall the producers still busy with field work with harvesting and/or seeding for next year's crops.

## **ADAMS County, Lee Showalter**

Fresh apple harvest is in full swing. Gala harvest is complete for most growers. Early Fujis and Golden Delicious will be the main focus for many growers in the coming week. Recent rains have continued to be a bit spotty. But most growers have received adequate moisture to eliminate any dry conditions. Cooler weather is also being helpful to color red varieties as they approach harvest.

## **ADAMS County, Thomas Kerr**

Some showers, but too late for most crops. Early short season corn planted early is now being harvested with moisture around 20-22% and yields of 150 - 180 bu. Later planted corn will not fare as well. Hay and pasture very short at this time.

## **ALLEGHENY/BEAVER/BUTLER Counties, Luke Fritz**

Corn silage harvest is winding down, fall herbicides are being applied, hauling manure and planting cover crops.

#### **CAMBRIA County, Dolly Little**

Potato harvesting continues as well as corn silage. About 10% of soybeans have dropped their leaves. Finally received some much needed rain.

## **CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker**

Silo filling moving forward. Some needed rainfall. 2" in my gauge.

## **COLUMBIA County, John O Yocum**

Only received 1.0" rain in 2 events (0.5in each event). Plants wilted again the next day after the rain events.

#### **LEBANON County, Jeff Graybill**

After nearly 3 weeks of dry weather, rain arrived on Thursday. Amounts varied but all areas received at least an inch. Some areas received a little over 2 inches. Chopping for corn silage is in progress with high moisture corn harvest around the corner.

#### **MERCER County, Jim Rust**

We received 0.7 inches of rainfall Saturday thru Sunday. The moisture has already perked up the fields and we need more rainfall. Many Amish farmers are chopping silage the past few days. Pumpkins are being harvested daily. Area corn mazes are open for the fall season. The fair season is over for Mercer County.

## WESTMORELAND County, Thomas Sierzega

Much needed rain finally arrived this week. All crops negatively affected by the extreme dry and heat.

#### YORK County, John Rowehl

Early reports of grain yields are very good. Much needed rain arrived in significant amounts on Thursday and Saturday.
