Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather – October 02nd, 2017:

Pennsylvania had an excellent week for field activities with an average of 7.0 days suitable for field work. Temperatures were reported with a high of 93° (F), a low of 28° (F) and a state average temperature of 57° (F). Dry and cooler temperatures reported for most part of State and over ten days without rain. Corn is drying rapidly, soybeans dropping leaves. Apple, corn and soybean harvests continue to be on schedule. The Apple harvest continues with good yields being reported. Vegetables are still being harvested, but coming into the end of the season. Producers are still busy in their fields with harvesting, land preparation and seeding this fall. Field activities involved the harvesting of apples, soybean, corn for silage and early grain, hay and alfalfa, some cover crop planting and soil preparation.

ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County started the week off in the high 60's for morning temperatures and got into the high 80's Monday through Wednesday was also sunny most of the week and humid and pretty unusual temperatures for this time of the year. Thursday's temperatures were in the mid 70's and nice fall breeze all day. Sunday morning temperatures were in the low 40s with some areas having frost on roofs and fields. Today started out 48 degrees and 64 till lunchtime with sunny blue skies with some clouds. Nice typical fall day. Corn and soybeans continue to mature and where ready soybeans and corn are being harvested for grain. Some additional corn silage was chopped this week also. Good yields are being reported throughout the county. Hay continued to be made this week as conditions were pretty good for this time of the year. Fall soil preparations are taking place as crops are harvested. Small grains are being seeded now also as crops being harvested. Apples continue to be harvested and good yields are being reported. Some producers though had change of markets from Fresh to process due to hail damage that occurred at least once but some had the misfortune of multiple hail storms. Vegetables are still being harvested in the county but are coming to end of their season but available at local farmers markets or fruit stands. Producers are still busy in their fields with harvesting, land preparation and seeding this fall. Upper Adams area is preparing for the 53rd National Apple Harvest Festival held October 7-8 14-15 at the South Mountain Fairgrounds near Arendtsville, PA. Come out to see the beautiful apple orchards with very colorful fruit hanging on the trees and enjoy the delicious food of all kinds and anything that is possible made out of apples.

ADAMS/FRANLIN Counties, Thomas Kerr

Dry. 24 days without rain. Corn drying down rapidly, causing problems with high moisture grain being too dry. Soybeans dropping leaves. Few acres now being harvested with average yield. Wheat and barley planted. Apple harvest in full, but some spot shortage of labor being reported.

CENTRE County, Dick A. Dicker

Conditions continue dry. Showers needed to get barley and wheat to emerge.

DAUPHIN/PERRY Counties, Liz Bosak

Over ten days of dry weather has accelerated maturing crops and hay production. Silage chopping and hay making have been in full swing. Isolated soybean fields have been harvested. Double-crop soybeans have not started leaf drop yet. Many double crop fields are very green. Most grass weeds are in full flower and setting seed including large crabgrass and the foxtails. Marestail (horseweed) is currently setting seed.

LACKAWANNA County, Eric Johnson

Hay season has virtually come to a close with the arrival of cooler temperatures and farmers will be harvesting corn silage over the next several weeks.

UNION County, James C. Brubaker

Soybean harvest is progressing well-likely finish this week. Yield is excellent. Planting cover crop, need rain for good germination.
