Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather – July 2nd, 2017:

Pennsylvania had a good week for field activities with an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. Temperatures were reported with a high of 93° (F), a low of 37° (F) and a state average temperature of 67° (F). Some rainfall was reported across the State. Sweet and tart cherry harvest continue into next week. Fruit crops are doing ok in most areas. Vegetables are looking pretty good so far. Overall producers very busy in fields and hoping for some rain the rest of the summer. Corn is reported to be 18 inches or more in height. Main activities for the week were haymaking, spraying herbicides and side dressing corn and winter wheat harvest.

ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County started the week with morning temperatures low 60's and sunny with nice breeze. Mid 70's daytime. Brief shower to barely dampen ground around 9 pm. Tuesday morning was 55 morning temperature and overcast then sun/clouds mid morning and high 70's no humidity. Wednesday morning was 49 degrees morning and sunny no humidity and into mid 70's. Thursday started around 50 degrees and sunny and got into mid 70's by lunchtime. Friday started 77 degrees and sunny and humid. We are dry in the county and all crops could use some moisture to keep them going. Corn and soybeans that were planted earlier are looking pretty good but some moisture would bring them along. Double cropped soybeans after hay, barley and wheat are being seeding now. Barley harvest is completed and good yields are being reported. Wheat harvest started this week with good yields being reported. This weekend producers will be busy with wheat harvest and baling hay. Cherry harvest started this week. Some producers thought the storm the other week was going to be more of a loss but once picking not as bad. Still damaged areas with wind whip but not as much as they thought. Cherries will be harvested into next week. Apples are looking pretty good. Early peaches started to be harvested also. Vegetables are looking pretty good so far. Overall producers very busy in fields and hoping for some rain the rest of the summer.

ADAMS/FRANKLIN Counties, Thomas Kerr

Cherry harvest is now in full. Some reported damage in loss due to a strong storm with wind whipped cherries. Definitely a loss, but don't know how much was lost. Wheat harvest has begun.

CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker

Good week for field activity. 1 inch rainfall.

DAUPHIN/PERRY Counties, Liz Bosak

Hot, dry weather in Dauphin and Perry counties for last week. Marestail escapes in corn fields and at field edges approaching 18 inches or more in height. Barley harvest and straw baling continued. No insect or disease problems to note for soybean. Typical populations of bean leaf beetle and a few Japanese beetles. First generation European corn borer larvae are present in fields with non-Bt corn.

JUNIATA/SNYDER County, William C. Sheaffer

Wheat harvest has begun with the yields being above average. Corn is being stressed on the lighter soils from the heat and lack of topsoil moisture. One half inch and more of rain came at the end of the week. Main activities for the week were haymaking, spraying herbicides and side dressing corn.

LANCASTER County, Jeff Graybill

Wheat harvest is in full swing with many excellent yields being reported and low toxin levels. Will be a busy week for double crop soybean planting.

YORK County, John Rowehl

Early planted corn fields tasseling. Wheat harvest in full swing. Grass hay is old but getting cut. Early planted soybeans beginning to flower.
