#### Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather – April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2018:

Pennsylvania had a poor week for field activities with an average of 1 day suitable for field work. Temperatures were reported with a high of 74° (F), a low of 10° (F) and a state average temperature of 41.6° (F). Cool wet weather has limited field work. Fruit crops no damage, but about two weeks late. No spring fieldwork done yet. Pasture and grass crops just beginning to show growth.

#### ADAMS County, Judy A. Behney

Adams County is plenty wet from the snowfall that we had last week in which melted this week. We also had some other rainfall this week so water is laying in the fields. Temperatures have been cooler at night 30's and about mid 40's to 50's this week. We had a little sun later in day Thursday and about 64 degrees. This morning temperatures started at 64 degrees but will drop as cold front moves through today. Has been raining on and off this morning. Some mornings this week it took a while for the fog to burn off. Small grains and cover crops are looking pretty good and greening up with the warmer temperatures. Hay is coming out of dormancy. Producers are readying their planting and harvesting equipment for this crop year and taking care of necessary paperwork before they get busy in the fields with fieldwork.

#### **ADAMS/FRANLIN Counties, Thomas Kerr**

Cool wet weather has limited field work. Fruit crops no damage, but about two weeks late. No spring fieldwork done yet. Pasture and grass crops just beginning to show growth.

#### **CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker**

Spring is here, we need some warm dry days to do alfalfa sowing and fertilizer spreading.

#### DAUPHIN/PERRY County, Liz Bosak

Snow arrived in Dauphin and Perry counties on Monday April 2. Winter annual weeds have been growing steadily despite the cold weather. No insect or disease activity observed.

#### JUNIATA/SNYDER Counties, William C. Sheaffer

It appears as if some wheat stands have been reduced in the low lying poorly drained area. The main activities for the week were spreading manure and top dressing winter grains.

Calving season for our beef cattle has been easier with the somewhat milder weather. The pasture looks greener each day. No spring field work has been completed as of April 1st.


#### **SOMERSET County, Dale Kriner**
