Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather: According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Pennsylvania, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 1, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 8 percent short, 86 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 7 percent short, 89 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Pasture conditions ranged from 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 51 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

ADAMS County, Judy Behney

Adams County's temperatures were cooler mornings high 50's low 60's and daytime temperatures in the 70's with mid 80's towards end of week. Some areas had some showers mid-week but not much accumulation but we are grateful with what moisture we had. Corn and soybeans continue to mature. Some corn is turning brown and drying down due to lack of rainfall past month and also corn silage is being chopped in the county. Some of the ears on the stalks have been stunted and will affect the yields this year. Soybeans are showing pods however not filling out due to lack of moisture the past month. Yields will also be affected. Hay continues to be made when weather conditions permits. Peaches and apples continue to be harvested with decent yields being reported. Some areas had earlier hail which is affecting quality. Producers not sure how apples will hold up in storage but time will tell. Vegetables are readily available at farmers markets and at roadside stands at the farms. Overall producers are being kept busy with all types of duties around their farms from readying equipment for tillage, seeding and harvesting this fall and also chopping silage and seeding cover crops and fall seedings. Some

moisture would still be beneficial for most crops and soils in the county. Adams County had sporadic rainfall on Sunday evening and also throughout the day on Monday. York Springs got 0.5 " Sunday evening and 0.5" Monday. Other areas of the county only got a few drops. The county is still on the dry side.

ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr

Lot of corn for silage has been harvested. Just waiting for late planted double crop corn to mature. Cover crop seeding has begun. Peach harvest still one of the best in several years.

BRADFORD County, Casey Guindon

Some hay was made throughout the county in the early parts of this past week. Some corn silage harvest has begun, but most fields still have some maturing to do. Soybeans are looking excellent in many areas.

CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker

Good field work weather. 1/2 rainfall for the week.
