Pennsylvania Weekly Crop Weather: According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Pennsylvania, there were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 29, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 10 percent very short, 31 percent short, 58 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 3 percent very short, 22 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Pasture conditions ranged from 2 percent very poor, 28 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.

Adams County continues to be dry. A sprinkle happened Thursday afternoon but no accumulation. It's been 50's morning temperatures this week and daytime temperatures in the 80's. Corn and soybeans continue to mature. What was planted early is being harvested for grain and corn silage is still being harvested around the county. Moisture for corn is improving so more harvesting for grain is occurring. Hay continues to be made where applicable. Soil continues to be prepared for small grains/cover crops once crops are harvested. Nothing is emerging that was planted end of August due to lack of moisture. Apples continue to be harvested ahead of normal schedule. Concerns are how the crop is going to hold up with storing and quality issues from earlier events this year. Vegetables continue to be available at farmers markets and also farm markets. The producers are busy with all different types of field work depending on harvest and seedings for next year and are plenty busy while it's still dry to get through the fields. Upper Adams area is preparing for National Apple Harvest Festival held First full weekend and Second Weekend of October near Arendtsville, PA. Come out and enjoy everything you could possibly think of made out of an apple to eat or drink or take home for later enjoyment, arts and craft vendors and entertainment.

ADAMS/FRANKLIN County, Thomas Kerr

Dry weather allowed for continued prime apple harvest. Yields are coming up shorter than expected, but still normal. A lot of corn being combined but operators are stopping to combine soybeans. Cover crop is being planted, but no moisture to germinate it.

CENTRE County, Dick A. Decker Great week for fall field work

COLUMBIA County, John O. Yocum

Need rain for pastures and hay. Dry conditions are speeding maturity of corn and soybeans.

JUNIATA/SNYDER Counties, William C. Sheaffer

The conditions of above average temperatures and below average rainfall, is causing the corn and soybeans to mature ahead of normal. Activities for the week were making corn silage and seeding of gain and cover crops.

LANCASTER County, Christopher Burkhart

Dry weather has been a mixed blessing this fall. Corn is dry and harvest is going well but double-crop soybeans are suffering and will likely won't yield well. Likewise, grass needs rain and farmers are unsure about planting cover crops or cereals because of the dry conditions.

LANCASTER County, Jeff Graybill

Combines continue to roll with record yields reported here in Lancaster County. Two NCGA corn yield checks were approximately 335 b/a each and the best two soybean yields were just over 110 b/a. Hemp harvest is now in full swing. Several drying systems have been built and installed in the county while others are hanging the crop similar to tobacco. Manure is being hauled, cover crops and small grains planted, although some are holding off in hopes of rain as germination will be very uneven in this very dry soil.
