Agricultural Land Value and Cash Rent Highlights

The United States farm real estate value, a measurement of the value of all land and buildings on farms, averaged \$3,800 per acre for 2022, up \$420 per acre from 2021. Alabama farm real estate values increased \$200 per acre and Florida values increased \$580 per acre. Farm real estate values in Georgia increased \$290 per acre and in South Carolina values increased \$200 per acre.

Cash rent paid to landlords for all cropland in the United States increased \$7.00 to \$148.00 per acre in 2022. Cash rent for pasture increased to \$14.00 per acre up \$1.00 from last year. In Alabama, cash rent for cropland averaged \$69.00 per acre, an increase of \$2.50 from last year. Cash rent for cropland in Florida decreased by \$6.00 to \$121.00 per acre. Georgia cash rent for cropland was unchanged for 2022 at \$135.00 per acre. In South Carolina, cash rent for cropland increased \$5.00 to \$55.50 per acre.
