#### General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in South Carolina, there were 5.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, July 11, 2021. Precipitation ranged from trace amounts of rain to 7.2 inches. Average high temperatures ranged from the mid 80s to the low 90s. Average low temperatures ranged from the mid 60s to the high 70s.

#### **Crops**

Moderate rainfall and warmer temperatures improved crop conditions statewide. Soybean planting and the first hay cutting wrapped up as winter wheat harvest also neared completion. Tropical Storm Elsa brought heavy localized rain to the Midlands, Lowcountry, and Pee Dee regions which was much needed for field crops. Heavy winds from the storm caused cotton plants to bend over in the Pee Dee region but conditions remained stable. Due to the heavy rain, some fields became inaccessible for part of the week. Farmers in the Lowcountry region applied fungicide to corn fields by air while farmers in the Midlands continued to battle fungal diseases on the ground. Herbicide applications went out on cotton and peanuts to combat weeds and unwanted grasses. Pee Dee vegetable crops are still growing well with good harvest quality and quantities.

#### **Livestock and Pastures**

Warmer temperatures and heavy rain improved pasture and range conditions. Cattle remained in mostly good condition.


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


