2014 Washington Wine Grape Utilized Production Up 8 Percent White Riesling Up 26 Percent; Cabernet Sauvignon Down 1 Percent

Washington's 2014 wine grape production totaled 227,000 tons, up 8 percent from 2013. Overall, production of red varieties was up 1 percent from last year compared to a 16 percent increase in the production of white varieties. Of the top four producing varieties, White Riesling showed the largest increase, up 26 percent from 2013. Growers received an average of \$1,110 per ton for all varieties in 2014, unchanged from the previous year. Of all the published varieties, Grenache received the highest price per ton at \$1,674. White varieties in 2014 accounted for 53 percent of the total production, compared to 49 percent in 2013. White Riesling was the top producing variety grown in the State at 50,500 tons or 22 percent of the total. Chardonnay was ranked second, at 43,800 tons or 19 percent of the total. Next was Cabernet Sauvignon with 42,200 tons or 19 percent of the total. Merlot ranked fourth with 36,900 tons or 16 percent of the total. The average Cabernet Sauvignon price increased \$8 per ton from last year to \$1,448 and the average Chardonnay price was up \$6 per ton from 2013 to \$922. Growers received an average of \$799 per ton for White Riesling, \$3 more than 2013. The average Merlot price per ton decreased \$6 per ton from last year to \$1,180.

It should be noted that the 2014 production and price for all wine grapes is preliminary and is subject to revision in July 2015.
